- 3.Arrive 15 minutes before the start of your scheduled symposium and load your PowerPoint presentation onto the conference computer.
- 4.It is required that you leave an electronic copy of your presentation on the conference computer. Thank you for your understanding in this manner.
- 5.Please use only the allotted time for your presentation. It is important to keep the scientific program on schedule so each presenter has ample time to present his or her material.
- 6.Be prepared to field questions from the audience after your presentation if time permits. (Oral presenters may wish to limit presentations to 13 minutes to allow 2 minutes for questions & answers/Students 8 minutes to allow 2 minutes for questions & answers.)
- 7.Lastly, join in the discussion! Each symposium will have time for discussion at the conclusion of oral presentations and we want to hear your thoughts, ideas, and questions.
